Job Goal:

The overarching goal of this position is to provide a systemic support structure for students identified as needing additional academic and/or social emotional support. A major focus of this position is district leadership in the K-12 response to intervention. This position is also charged with advancing the district's commitment to the social and emotional health and well-being of its entire student population. This commitment shall entail the supervision and evaluation of programs touching upon student well-being, including in the areas of character education, health and physical education, health services, and counseling.

Performance Responsibilities:

- 1. Responsible for the supervision of
 - a. School Nurses K-12
 - b. Guidance Counselors 6-8
 - c. School and Family Liaisons K-8
 - d. Health Teachers K-12
- 2. Observe and evaluate counseling and/or teaching staff in areas identified by the superintendent or designee
- 3. Review and monitor the Intervention and Referral Services (I&RS) Process to ensure academic, social and emotional success
- 4. Collect, monitor, and utilize data to make informed decisions (academic and social-emotional) for students needing additional supports

- 5. Serves as the District HIB Coordinator
- 6. Serves as District 504 Compliance Officer for students
- 7. Serves as District Homeless Liaison
- 8. Oversees home instruction services for students across the District
- 9. Provide leadership in the develop of curriculum in health, physical education, and social-emotional learning
- 10. Assist in the development of policies and procedures to support all matters of student health and well-being
- 11. Works with district school physician to coordinate and oversee district health procedures, state mandates and protocol
- 12. Serve as the primary coordinator of Social and Emotional Learning and Character Education Programs with regard to professional development, curriculum development, budgetary needs, and outside agencies as needed
- 13. Complete grant applications related to Social and Emotional Learning
- 14. Coordinate counseling and support for students and staff
- 15. Ensure the effectiveness of district-wide programs in an effort to establish consistency and relevance across all grade levels
- 16. Serve as the point-person for all students re-entering the school setting from residential or out-patient programs
- 17. Provides resources and information to parents and school community with regard to students and staff well-being
- 18. Perform other related duties as assigned by the Superintendent or the Assistant Superintendent.

Non-aligned, Certificated Staff 12-month position as specified in contract with the Board of Education

Evaluation:

Performance of this position will be evaluated annually in accordance with state law and the provisions on the Board's policy on evaluation of certificated personnel.
