Dear Wall Township Public Schools Community:

We hope this summer has been a delightful one for you, your family, and friends. As you are probably aware, the 2023-2024 school year is upon us. You may also be aware that the first home varsity football game against Howell High School is scheduled for Friday, September 1 @ 7:00 PM. We hope to see you there!

Ticket prices are as follows: **\$3.00 for adults** and **\$2.00 for students and senior citizens**.

Tickets are available onsite for purchase. **For your convenience, tickets may be purchased electronically, [click here](#) for details or visit the "Extracurricular" tab on the Wall High School homepage.** Please be sure to visit the concession stand, located near the southern endzone.

The New Jersey Interscholastic Athletic Association (NJSIAA) and the Shore Conference leadership respectfully ask that we convey the following at the start of the fall season:

- Spectator signs or banners will not be permitted on or around the stadium, any field, or gymnasium. Spectators who arrive at the gate with a sign or banner will be refused admission.
- Noise makers, whistles, air-horns, or radios will not be permitted in the stadium area.
- No possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages.
- No smoking or vaping on school grounds.
- No use, possession, or distribution of drugs or illegal substances.
- No pets.
- Bags are not permitted in the stadium area.
- Anyone who leaves the stadium area will not be permitted to return for that game.
- All spectators must be seated in the appropriate section designated by the site manager. No spectators are allowed near the team benches or in the endzones. Visiting team spectators should sit in the bleachers farthest from the High School (easterly).
- Any spectator showing an outward display of poor sportsmanship which could possibly lead to a disturbance will be removed from the campus or turned over to the Wall Police Department for resolution. This includes taunting, negative cheering, or confrontation with referees, opposing players, coaches, and parents.
- Spectators must comply with requests made by site managers, athletic directors, game officials, medical personnel, security/police, league officials, and school administration.
- Spectators are asked to demonstrate leadership at critical times – playing of the *National Anthem*, tending to injured participants, navigating stressful game situations, and negotiating dangerous circumstances (e.g., lighting) are examples of such critical times.

We hope to see you supporting our student athletes throughout the school year.
