

Interdisciplinary Teaming

- 6 Teams = 2 per grade level

ELA Placement

- Everyone enters into ELA 6
- Course Sequencing
 - \circ ELA 6 \rightarrow ELA 7 \rightarrow ELA 8
 - ELA 6 → ELA 7 → ELA 8 Advanced
 - ELA 6 → ELA 7 Advanced → ELA 8 Advanced
- Multiple measures are used to determine readiness for ELA 7 Advanced & ELA 8 Advanced
 - MP Grades
 - Writing Grades
 - iReady Scores
 - NJSLA Scores
 - Teacher Recommendation





Math Placement

- Math Placement (determined by fifth grade testing)
 - Math 6
 - PreAlgebra
- Math 6 or PreAlgebra
 - Math Placement Test (March 2024)
 - iReady End of Year (Late May / Early June)
- Course Sequencing
 - Math 6 → Math 7 → Math 8 (PreAlgebra)
 - Math 6 → Math 7 → Algebra 1
 - PreAlgebra → Algebra 1 → Geometry





World Language

- Full year course:
 - Spanish
 - French
 - Latin
- Progression into high school





Physical Education (Full Year Elective)

- Full year course includes:
 - Physical Education
 - Health Education (October March)
 - Replaces Physical Education at those times during the school year





Band, Orchestra, Choir (Full Year Elective)

- Each is a full year elective.
- Instruction is provided 5 days/week
 - 1 period daily
 - Lesson differentiation will occur during lunch periods





General Music....and.... Art (Half-year Electives)

- BAND/ORCHESTRA/Choir is not chosen, students will participate in the following:
 - General Music 6 (One Semester)
 - Art 6 (One Semester)
 - Organized by Team
