

# FUNDING.

**STATE AID ONLY COMES WITH A VOTER-APPROVED BOND REFERENDUM.**

Two questions on the ballot: 1. "Must-do" projects with no property tax increase, and 2. Important projects that would result in a slight increase.

## QUESTION 1

- \$53.1 million in renovations and replacements for building functionality
- \$18 million of that paid with state aid
- Bond payments made with no property tax increase

## QUESTION 2

- \$13.5 million in more improvements to schools and athletic facilities
- \$2 million of that paid with state aid
- Tax increase of about \$5/month

## YES VOTE:

\$20M in state aid for all projects

## NO VOTE:

Critical work still done, but without state aid

**QUESTION 1 MUST PASS FOR QUESTION 2 TO PASS. IF VOTERS REJECT QUESTION 1 BUT APPROVE QUESTION 2, NEITHER PROPOSAL WOULD PASS.**

Perfect timing: Wall is finishing payments on previous improvements that voters authorized in 1998.

Renewing the current level of debt payments would continue the cycle of repairing, replacing, and renovating that keeps Wall's schools maintained and Wall's tax rate steady.
