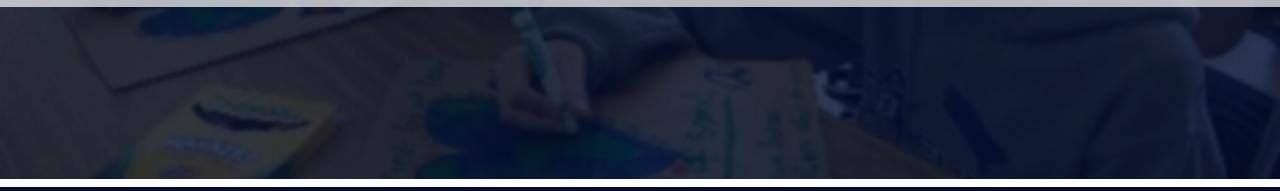

#### **PRIORITY 3**

 Low Priority - Addresses aesthetics and other issues outside of Priority 1 or 2

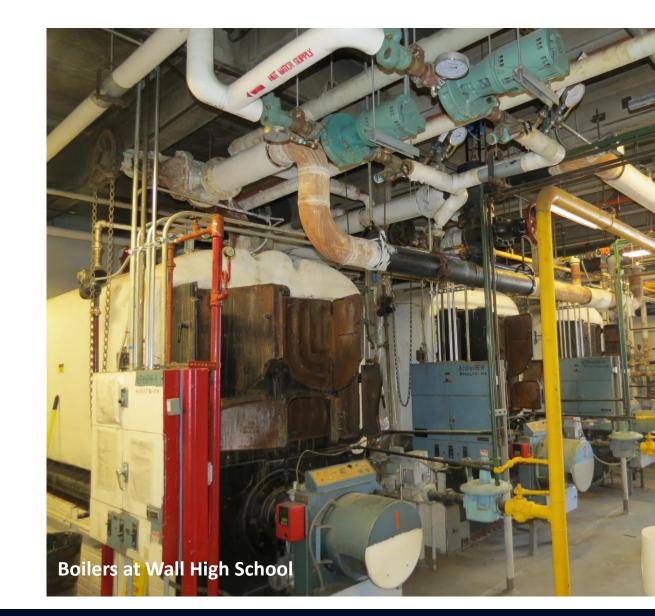

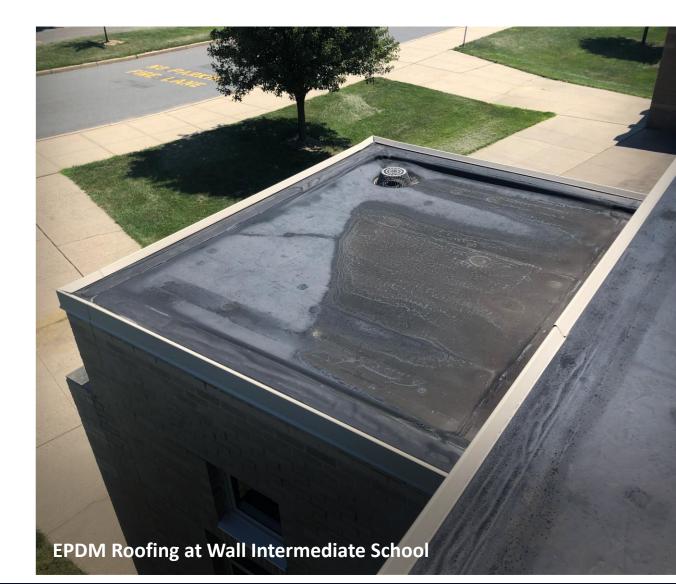

### **Building Envelope**

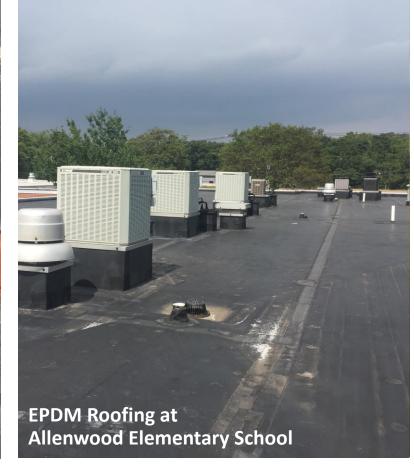
- Replace low-slope and asphalt shingle roofs that are out of warranty or for which the warranty will expire by the time voter-approved work is complete
- Replace Single Pane glazed vinyl and aluminum windows with thermally broken insulated window/storefront assemblies



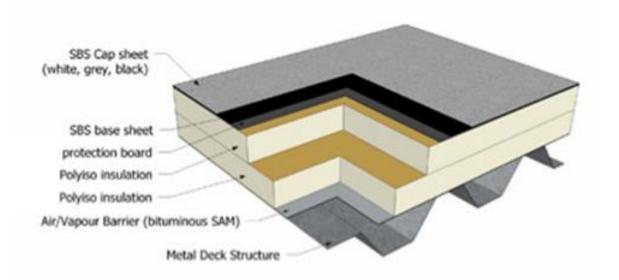

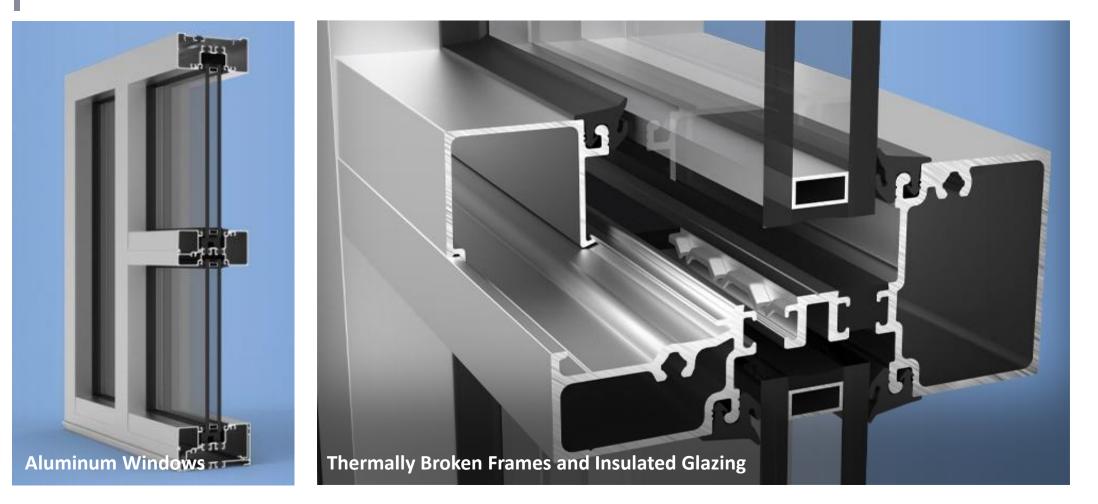

#### **Typical SBS Modified Bituminous Roofing Assembly**

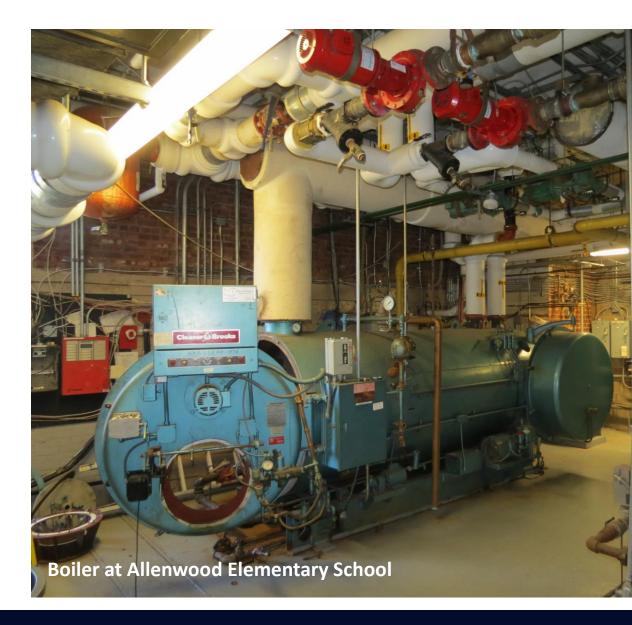

### **Building Systems**

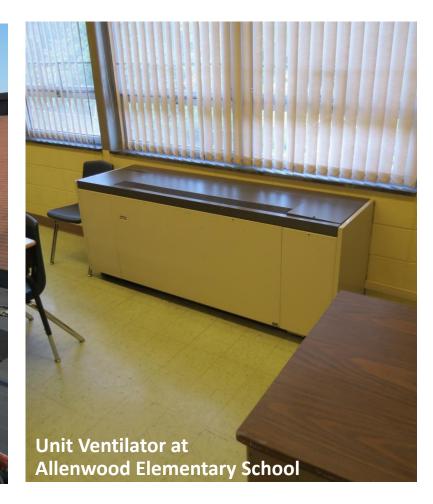
- HVAC Upgrades including Unit Ventilator Replacement, Fan Coil Replacement, Boiler Replacement and Roof Top Unit Replacement

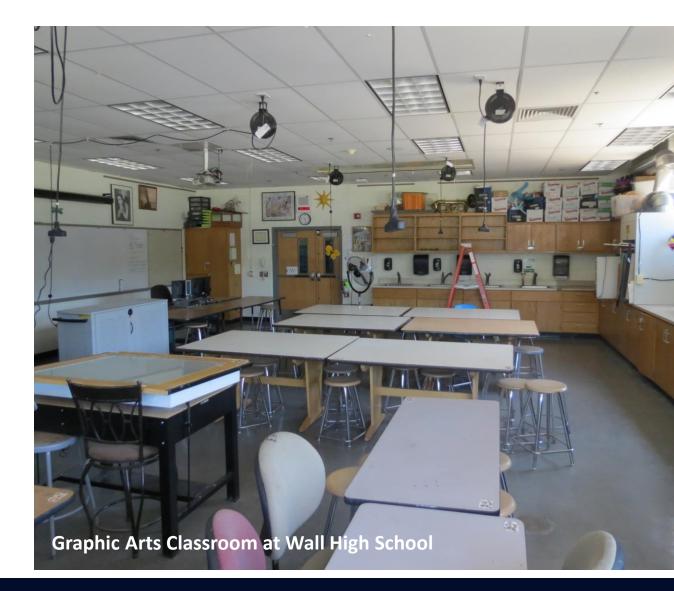

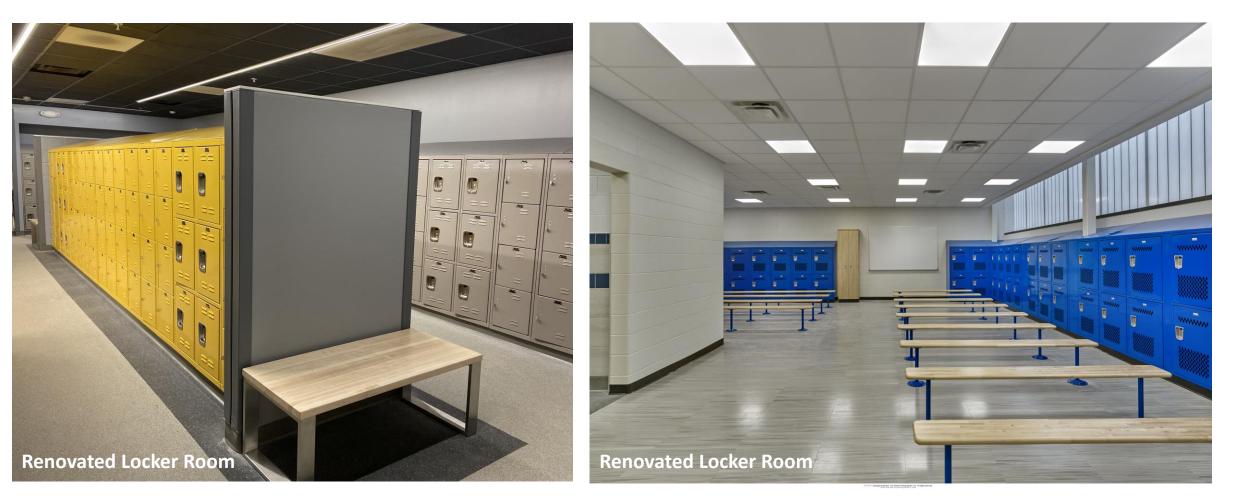

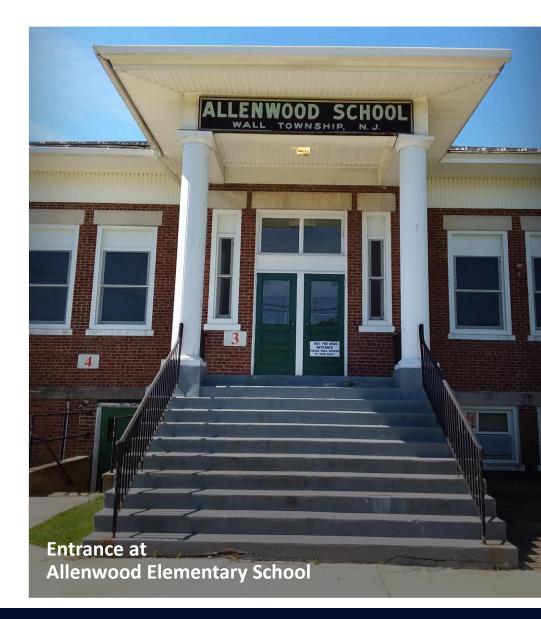

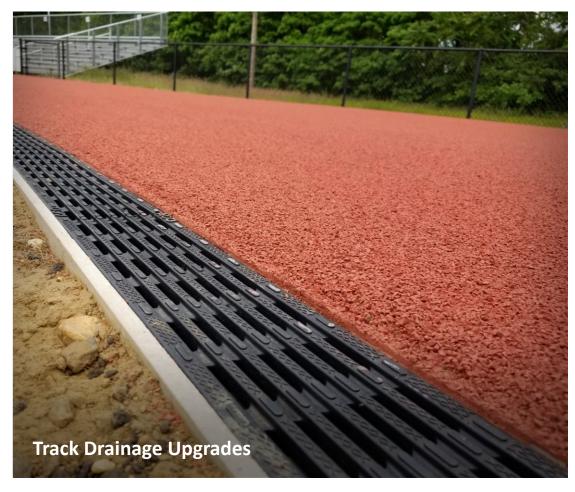

### Question 1 Total = \$53.1M (approx.)

- Includes the highest priority items
- No tax impact due to the retiring of debt in FY 2023-2024
  - Average Assessed Home: \$483,357
  - Current Annual Debt Service Payment for average assessed home: \$185 (\$15.50/month) or \$0.038 per \$100 of assessed home value.
  - Projected Annual Debt Service Payment for average assessed home: \$179.38 (\$14.95/month) or \$0.037 per \$100 of assessed home value.
- All projects approved by DOE for 34% debt service aid
  - HVAC, Electrical, Fire Alarm, Classroom Alterations, Toilet Room Alterations, Roofing, Windows

## FINANCING



### Question 2 Total = \$13.5M (approx.)

- Question 2 is contingent on Question 1 passing as well
- Debt Service Payment will have a Tax impact for Wall Residents:
  - Average Assessed Home: \$483,357
  - Debt Service Payment for average assessed home: \$60 annually (\$5/month) or \$0.012 per \$100 of assessed home value.
- \$5.9M of projects approved by DOE for 34% debt service aid
  - HVAC, ADA Site Upgrades, Art Classroom Renovations and Windows
- \$7.6M of projects ineligible for debt service aid
  - Site, Paving and Athletics projects

## FINANCING



### What if the Referendum Doesn't Pass?

### Without a Voter Approved Bond

### Referendum:

- High priority needs will have to be paid for from the operating budget
- WTPS will lose the opportunity for \$20 million in state aid
- Local property taxes will cover 100% of project costs
- Individual projects stretched over time will lose the economy of scale

### Why Now?

- Addresses District's most critical needs
- Approved for State Funding on eligible costs
- Minimal Tax Impact due to retiring debt
- Bundling projects together leverages economy of scale
- Improvements would include more cost-efficient building systems and reduced risks for repairs
- Referendum reduces the impact on annual maintenance budget, allowing the savings to be used for completion of HVAC, roofing, windows, and code compliance

## ACT NOW



### Conclusion

- Old is a key word
  - Some restrooms & equipment are original to buildings
  - Two schools were built before 1900
- Protecting assets is a theme
  - Roofing, boilers, other critical systems
  - Modern fire alarms
  - Keep Wall's schools desirable
- Fiscal responsibility is the core
  - Leverage energy efficiencies
  - Address needs before emergencies
  - Capture state aid

This is part of a strategic, proactive approach to improve and protect facilities and the people who use them.
