COVID-19 STATEMENT - Class of 2022

On March 16, 2020, Wall High School closed for the remainder of the school year due to Covid-19. A statewide stay at home order was issued in March 2020 and students were required to complete the academic school year virtually. Clubs and activities continued to meet virtually. Spring sports season was cancelled.

During the 2020-2021 school year, students who attended Wall High School were on a hybrid schedule for marking periods 1, 2 and 3. Students were grouped alphabetically and attended school on alternate days. On the days they did not attend in person they worked virtually, logged into Google Classroom and received synchronous instruction. During marking period 4, students had the opportunity to attend Wall High School 5 day per week.

Currently, students are attending Wall High School for full days of in person instruction with all extracurricular activities and sports.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT PROGRAM

At Wall High School, 192 students took one or more exams in 21 different subjects. A total of 363 exams were administered with 74% of our students scoring 3 or higher. The College Board has recognized 64 total AP Scholars; 24 AP Scholars, 19 AP Scholars with Honor, 21 AP College Board's 7th Annual AP District Honor Roll for significant College Accounting to meet college graduation requirements. gains in student access and success.

DUAL ENROLLMENT/MIDDLE COLLEGE PROGRAM

Seniors participate in Dual Enrollment with Brookdale Community College. Classes are taken on the BCC campus among the general population. Participating seniors can earn 6 credits each semester. Additionally, Wall High School students may enroll in the Middle Scholars with Distinction. Wall High School was placed on the College Program offered through Fairleigh Dickinson University for

BLOCK SCHEDULING

Wall High School has an alternating block schedule (A/B). Students attend four classes each day lasting for 84 minutes each. Classes are taught for the entire school year with four different classes on day A and day B. AP Biology, AP Chemistry and AP Calculus BC earn 10 credits and are taught in a double block.

WALL BUSINESS & FINANCE ACADEMY (WBFA)

Students who are accepted into the WBFA will tailor their elective choices to a focus on business and finance. They must take a minimum of 20 credits of mandatory business courses and successfully complete an internship between the summer of their junior and senior years. Community business leaders partner with Wall High School by securing internships, shadowing experiences, volunteering in classrooms, acting as mentors and serving on our advisory board. Professional development workshops are also provided for WBFA members through our Academy Knights Program. Students who complete the program are graduates of the Wall High School Business and Finance Academy and receive a "Certificate of Business and Financial Studies" as well as a medal of recognition to wear at the Wall High School graduation ceremony.

WALL PRE-ENGINEERING ACADEMY

The Pre-Engineering Academy, founded in 2013, is a selective program with a focus on engineering at the high school level. Students are accepted to the academy through an application process in 8th grade that places an emphasis on academics, character and extra-curricular activities. The rigorous curriculum involves students taking Honors and Advanced Placement courses in math and science, as well as a 4-year sequence of engineering courses culminating with a senior capstone project. Students receive professional development in career readiness and are exposed to industry through site visits and shadowing experiences in engineering. Academy members also complete internships at local engineering firms across many engineering disciplines including: structural, mechanical, environmental, networking, and transportation.

SERVICE AND LEADERSHIP ACADEMY

Students who enter this academy will be expected to complete a minimum of one-hundred community service hours per year. Student electives will be tailored towards our JROTC/NNDCC and Naval Science program with an additional focus on citizenship and community. Students will also have the opportunity to earn up to twelve college credits through the University of Louisiana at Monroe. However, this is not a requirement. What makes this academy unique, is that it is open to all students without a placement exam. This academy is recommended for students who are considering a career in public safety, public service, service science such as NASA, law, government, social services, education, clergy, or the military.
